How to Manage Workers' Comp for Remote Workers

Many things about our daily lives have returned to normal as we have come out of the pandemic. But there is one change that is likely never to go back to the old ways, and that is employees working from home.

Much has been asked about managing remote employees effectively: Are they putting in the hours? Are they as accessible? Is the lack of employee interaction a detriment? Are they staying in their pajamas all day (okay, maybe that one's not as important)? But what can't be ignored is how a "remote workplace" impacts an employer's workers' compensation.

Let's explore some key areas that every employer needs to stay aware of.

1. Where are they working from within their home?

Over the past several decades, a tremendous amount of time and money has been spent on improving office ergonomics. Are your employees working from home lying on the bed, couch, or floor in all sorts of problematic positions?

Insist that employees working from home have a space where they consistently work with an appropriate work surface and a chair that is at an appropriate height to work safely and not trigger any ergonomic issues. Employers may consider helping their remote employees obtain appropriate furniture if they don't have a home office.

2. Where are they working within the country?

One joy of full-time remote work is that you are no longer tethered to a specific location. In many cases, remote workers can do their job from anywhere.

However, this benefit for the employee can become an issue for the employer because of how the workers' compensation policy is written. A standard workers' compensation policy covers "primary" states, which are states where your business has locations staffed with employees. It can also cover "other" states where an employee may travel temporarily.

In communities near a state line, it is common for an employee to live in one state and work in another state. When everyone was in the office, you would likely have a single state on your policy as primary: the state where you have your office. If employees are now working from home in a different state, you must add that state as primary to your workers' compensation policy.

In other businesses, employees have left the area altogether. Case in point: My next-door neighbor moved to North Carolina from Texas to work remotely. The same issue applies here: You must have the states where your employees work listed as primary states on your workers' compensation policy. Thus her employer in Texas had to include North Carolina on their policy.

This seems a simple issue to solve, but in reality, it can be quite complicated. Many insurance companies are limited as to what states they can add to policies, or they may decline to do so. This can result in your business having to purchase separate workers' comp policies for the states where your primary insurance provider can't or won't issue a policy.

If you have employees working from home outside your primary state(s) of operation, you will want to discuss this with your insurance agent.

3. When are they working?

A frequent question we hear regarding remote workers is, "What if my employee decides to go check their e-mail in the middle of the night and falls down the stairs? Is that a workers' comp claim?"

Many factors go into the answer, but the more significant concern is your expectations for when your employee is working. Setting clear expectations about when you do and do not expect your employees to be working could potentially help determine whether or not an "after hours" injury is covered by workers' compensation.

Pay Transparency Brings in Stronger Job Applicants

There has been much discussion about pay transparency recently especially given the fact that several states and localities are implementing new laws in this area. Earlier this week, The Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) released new research detailing how organizations are approaching pay transparency.

Some employers have raised concerns that listing pay ranges may lead to negative outcomes such as candidates not taking the total compensation into consideration, but SHRM research shows most organizations that list salary ranges lead to favorable outcomes.

Around 42% of more than 1,300 HR professionals sampled said their organization operates in a location that requires pay ranges to be included in job postings. When not required by law, however, over two in three (67%) HR professionals say their organization voluntarily lists start pay in their job postings sometimes, often, or always. What's more, 32% of these organizations began including start pay information in their job postings within the past year – signaling some employers may be planning ahead in anticipation of new pay transparency trends.

“The path toward equity requires more than recognizing that there are systemic gaps that adversely impact one group over another and then addressing them proactively,” shared Emily M. Dickens, SHRM’s chief of staff and head of public affairs, in a statement. “It requires more directed education on the compensation process, increased engagement with compensation specialists and HR professionals, and an understanding of how to leverage one’s talent through personal advocacy when armed with this information and allyship within the organization.”

Additional key findings include:

- 70% of organizations that list pay ranges on job postings say that doing so has led to more people applying to their postings.
- Nearly two-thirds (66%) of organizations that list pay ranges on job postings say that doing so has increased the quality of applicants they’re seeing.
- 65% of organizations that list pay ranges on job postings say that doing so makes them more competitive in attracting top talent.

How Pay Transparency Influences Applicant Behavior

- 82% of U.S. workers are more likely to consider applying to a job if the pay range was listed in the job posting.
- 74% of U.S. workers say that they are less interested in applying to job postings that do not list a pay range.
- 73% of U.S. workers are more likely to trust organizations that provide pay ranges in job postings than ones that do not.

When considering pay transparency in job postings, organizations will also need to prepare for how doing so may affect current employees.

- 36% of organizations said this change caused more current employees to ask about receiving a pay raise.

PPE: EYE PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION

GotSafety

There are four main types of injuries to the eye in the workplace.

- Sudden blow to the eye
- Chemical exposure
- Penetration of the eye
- Burns from intense light

HAZARDS

The highest numbers of accidents occur from the use and misuse of tools and equipment. This includes hand tools and tools that use compressed air. The majority of workers receiving eye injuries were not wearing eye protection. Other injuries can occur when:

- There is poor housekeeping.
- There are splashes or vapors from chemicals.
- There is intense light from welding or lasers.
- Flying particles from saws or other types of grinders.

PREVENTION

The primary prevention to eye injury is protection. Keeping the eyes shielded with the proper equipment is essential.

• Safety Glasses

These are the most commonly used eye protection. They are made much stronger than street-wear lenses. They are impact resistant and come in prescription and non-prescription.

• Goggles

These are very similar to the safety glasses, but they fit much closer to the eyes. These are necessary when working in situations which could result in chemicals splashes, fumes vapors and dust injuries.

• Face Shields

Full-face shields are often required to guard against molten metal and chemicals splashes. These shields can be made to fit over a hard hat or to wear directly on the head.

• Equipment Guards

Plant equipment and machinery is the source of many eye injuries. Be sure to use guards, screens and shields that are attached to any equipment. Make sure they are always in place and used along with additional eye protection.

Don't forget the people who are bystanders or coworkers. If your job cannot be isolated, then your coworkers in your area also need to wear the proper eye protection.

INJURIES

If an injury does occur, prompt attention is essential.

Sudden Blow to the Eye

- Apply a cold compress without pressure, or tape crushed ice in a plastic bag to the forehead and allow it to rest gently on the injured eye.
- Seek immediate medical attention if pain continues, if vision is reduced, or if blood or discoloration appears in the eye.

Penetration of the Eye

- Do not wash out the eye.
- Do not try to remove a foreign object stuck in the eye.
- Seek immediate medical attention.

Chemical Splashes

This includes solvents, paints, hot liquids or other hazardous solutions can cause great damage.

- Check the label for specific first aid instructions and follow those instructions.
- If washing of the eye is on the label for treatment, wash the eye out for at least fifteen minutes. Hold the eye open with your fingers and look into the running water.

Foreign Particles

This includes dust, dirt, metal, wood chips and even an eyelash.

- Flush the eye with water until the foreign object has come out.
- If for some reason you cannot rinse the eye, loosely bandage it and get emergency medical treatment.
- Never rub or try to remove objects embedded in the eye.

CONCLUSION

Prevention is the key to protecting your eyes. Your ability to see is a very valuable asset. Don't take risks with your eyesight. Eye injuries are often permanent.

- Follow correct procedures when working.
- Never assume that you don't need to protect your eyes.
- If eye protection is needed for a job, it must be used regardless of the size of the job.

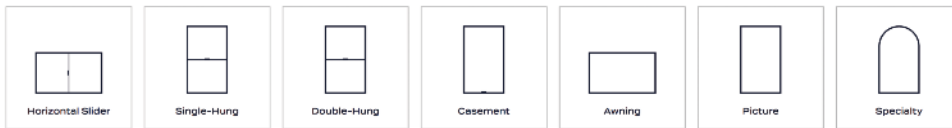

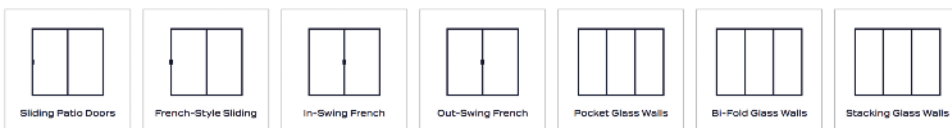

Mindful Approaches to Workplace Wellness

EHS Today

Jacob Aqua and Marshall Kupka-Moore begin every meeting with a breathing exercise. During our Zoom call, he led a brief guided meditation, asking us to close our eyes and take a few deep breaths.

“We start our meetings with a little bit of centering into the space that we can all arrive at and fully be present for the work,” Aqua explains after the short session.

Aqua and Kupka-Moore are co-founders of Source Wellness, an organization that helps businesses develop mental health programs focused on mindfulness techniques. As EHS Today research shows, more companies are incorporating stress-reduction practices, such as mindfulness and yoga, into their corporate health programs to address employee wellness.

Nearly one-third of employers responding to the EHS Today Mental Health in the Workplace 2021 survey conducted earlier this year say they offer meditation, mindfulness or yoga programs at their company. The pandemic has many companies rethinking the importance of mental health as part of their overall wellness programs.

“One thing the pandemic did was it broadened the definition of mental health,” says Aaron Harvey, who founded a mental health advocacy group called Made of Millions. In the past, mental health was primarily recognized as diagnosed conditions, such as depression, but it may also encompass other emotional issues and life-changing events, such as grief, stress and divorce, Harvey says.

Creating Awareness

Harvey started Made of Millions in 2016 after struggling with obsessive-compulsive disorder while working as the owner of an ad agency. It took him nearly 30 years of suffering before he knew his diagnosis. He would like to see the workplace fill a gap in health education.

“If we are able to use the corporation as a device or distribution vehicle to give people the psychoeducation that they need to better understand what’s going on, they can then better navigate a very broken healthcare system,” he says. Harvey also serves as an advisor for Mind Together, a coalition of brands led by Verizon Media working to address mental health and set a new standard in how employees are supported at work. The growth in mental health awareness in the corporate world is more evident since the pandemic, says Dr. Michelle Riba, a professor of psychiatry at the University of Michigan and codirector of workplace mental health solutions at the school’s Eisenberg Family Depression Center.

“We recently had a major conference on this topic, with over 300 attendees throughout the country and Canada

from employers small and large, and mental health is clearly a growing and major issue for the workplace and all ages and genders,” she says.

When it comes to addressing mental health in the workplace, employers need to create an environment where workers are comfortable talking about it, experts say. One participant in the EHS Today survey wrote, “Employees are depressed, and issues are never addressed in time. There are no clear communication lines between management and staff.” Harvey says employers must go beyond sloganeering to foster a culture of mental health awareness.

“It can’t just be like, ‘Hey, we understand mental health is tough; if you’re struggling reach out to us,’” he says. “You have to do the work behind the scenes first, having strategic alignment with the management team, HR team and even the legal team, and then going out and messaging it.”

More Relaxed, More Productive

Technology is one way employers can encourage staff to manage stress and keep tabs on their mental health.

For example, Insight Timer is an app that sends reminders to perform breathing exercises at regular intervals, says Aqua, whose title at Source Wellness is chief mindfulness officer.

“Everyone has time to take deep breaths because we have to breathe throughout the day,” he says. “It’s not like you’re taking time off breathing when you’re working.”

Calm is another meditation app that employers can distribute to employees, Riba notes. Calm offers a business-specific plan that employers can purchase. Other educational tools include webinars or lectures from mental health professionals, she says.

While employers have ethical reasons to address mental health, it also has an impact on their bottom line.

“It’s very expensive for employers to have to fill positions and we know that we’re seeing many service industries are hurting very badly because they don’t have enough employees,” Riba says. “So it’s very important to think about not only recruitment but retention, and part of that is they’re learning many Millennials, for example, are looking at jobs and asking about whether or not there are mental health days, and asking very important questions about this topic.”

Kupka-Moore explains that many large, multinational companies are incorporating mindfulness programs into their organizations because they recognize the productivity benefits.

“We’re starting to realize that our mental health heavily impacts our physical health, and our mental and physical health together very heavily impact our productivity,” says Kupka-Moore, CEO of Source Wellness.

“Once people can see there is a very, very clear connection between the amount of money you can make and the amount of effectiveness you can derive from mindfulness, it’s going to be impossible for them not to take on that approach.”

Bank failures could lead to heightened cyber threats

The collapse of Silicon Valley Bank and Signature Bank, combined with spreading worries of a calamitous fallout, could create new hooks for a spree of news-driven social engineering attacks.

Researchers at Proofpoint observed a phishing campaign designed to exploit the banking crisis with messages impersonating several cryptocurrencies. Threat hunters and cybersecurity professionals across multiple firms warned organizations to be on the lookout for malicious activity.

Threat actors don't just follow the news — they react to it and identify new ways to target potential victims during moments of heightened sensitivity. Phishing and business email compromise attacks are often tailored to take advantage of the fear and uncertainty surrounding major events.

"CISA is closely monitoring the situation," a spokesperson for the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency said. "Currently, we are not tracking any cyberattacks or incidents associated with Silicon Valley Bank."

Cybersecurity professionals, as is their wont, are operating under the assumption that threat actors will turn this banking crisis into fuel for cyberattacks.

"Ultimately, because these crises can help to create a sense of urgency, this moment in time can be an effective tool for threat actors," Arctic Wolf CISO Adam Marrè said via email.

Arctic Wolf hasn't observed a notable volume of threats, but it has seen an uptick in newly registered domains related to SVB since federal regulators took over the bank's deposits on Friday. The cybersecurity firm expects some of those domains to serve as a hub for phishing attacks.

Professionals should scrutinize for spoofed email addresses and fake emails designed to facilitate an urgent response and be extra cautious across all exchanges, Marrè said.

Organizations should be especially vigilant with financial transactions and take additional precautions to avoid fraud via phishing or business email compromise.

Phishing was the top cybercrime type reported to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center in 2022, according to an annual report published Friday. Phishing accounted for nearly 2 in 5 cybercrime incidents reported to the FBI last year, for a total of 300,000 reported crimes.

Phishing lures target vulnerable employees

Finance employees, which often have access to an organization's banking information for billing and payments, are an optimal target for threat actors conducting phishing or business email compromise attacks.

"Gaining access to a finance department laptop could provide a windfall for cybercriminal," Eyal Gruner, co-founder and CEO at Cynet, said via email. "With all the chaos and fear as a result of the SVB collapse, these employees are particularly vulnerable right now."

"If the victim is a client of SVB and has funds tied up there, then they get additional accounts robbed, things can go from very bad to horrific very quickly," Gruner said.

The opportunity for fraud is massive and not just limited to direct customers of SVB but rather anyone doing business with those organizations, according to Expel CISO Greg Notch.

"There will be lots of changes to payment information between businesses, creating counterparty risk," Notch said via email.

Some altered transactions may go unnoticed as scrambling activity between counterparties increases over the coming weeks, Notch added.

The failure of two banks in as many days and a widespread concern that this banking crisis could spread is just the latest event of global consequence for threat actors to glom onto.

"Attackers are always looking for an angle. Leveraging a chaotic situation where people are confused, looking for information and not sure where to turn, they're more apt to open random emails that may help them," Gruner said. For adversaries, "the more people are confused, scared and looking for answers the better."

Sizable industrial projects planned for north Sonoma County

The north Santa Rosa corridor real estate office market struggled over 2022, while industrial properties around Sonoma County airport and north had historically low vacancy.

The submarket's office space had a significant increase in vacancy, going up to 7.2% in fourth quarter from 5.3% at year-end 2021.

COVID-19 continues to play a role in companies' decisions on how many employees will be working in the office as opposed to working from home. This dilemma is affecting all sizes of businesses but from a vacancy standpoint it is the larger firms that are creating the spike in the overall market vacancy. The preponderance of leasing was either renewals or space sizes under 5,000 square feet.

Many transactions were with three years or less in term and full-service rents ranging from \$1.80 per square foot monthly to \$2.25.

Significant leases in the Sonoma County airport area for 2022 included Evolve Restorative Center for 11,011 square feet at 220 Concourse Blvd.; Anova Education, 7,000 square feet, 475 Aviation Blvd.; Life Medical Holdings Inc., 5,115 square feet at 451 Aviation; and Providence Medical Foundation for 3,075 sf at 8911 Lakewood Drive.

Oak Valley Business Center has a unique opportunity for a large company to occupy a free-standing two-story, 40,000-square-foot office building either for sale or lease.

Industrial real estate in the north Santa Rosa corridor enjoys a 1.4% historic low vacancy rate, which continues to drive rental rates higher for existing space.

It continues to be very challenging to develop new industrial projects due to the cost of new construction, which is increasing due to shortages in construction material, increased labor costs and extremely long time periods to process plans through the county planning and permit department.

One challenge facing new development is the current uncertainty of electrical power. As PG&E is assessing what is available for new developments, it continues to be unclear as to what service is immediately available or delayed while waiting for a PG&E upgrade to the infrastructure to the entire area.

The demand by many local jurisdictions to go all electric in homes and businesses along with the push for electric cars is coming at a time when PG&E is not equipped to handle the service, and with the spike in the cost of utilities it is putting critical jobs at risk.

Industrial rental rates are \$1.15 per square foot on a gross basis to \$1.25 a square foot on a triple-net basis. Industrial build-to-suit deals are still an option but difficult with the increased pricing in construction costs as well as the increased value in land due to the lack of existing inventory.

Airport Business Center has several large parcels which are zoned for a mix of industrial uses and is poised nicely for build-to-suit development that can accommodate projects from 35,000 square feet to several hundred thousand square feet.

Industrial leasing was modest with the lack of inventory: 8,773 square feet to Vortex Industries at 3130 Regional Parkway and 8,246 sf to Leaf Filter North LLC at 5813 Skylane Blvd.

Another significant sale was Ahlborn Fence & Steel Inc., which purchased 100 Henry Station Road in Ukiah, previously occupied by Retech Systems. That included 30 acres of land and several building totaling 138,000 square feet.

Sonoma County Airport District continues to process the Sonoma County Airport Area Specific Plan update, which could have important zoning changes with potential negative effects on current property and long-term property values.



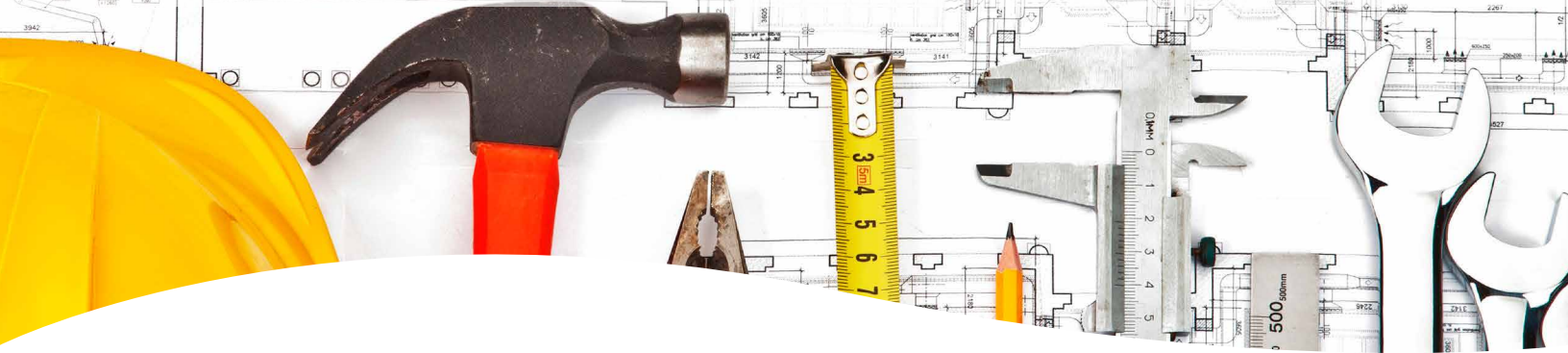

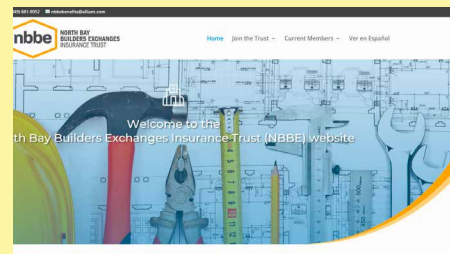

Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

You might become a ‘consultant’ but like swimming it’s likely you need a license when getting in the deep water. Another contractor helps illustrate how taking a license test can make a big ‘reciprocal’ difference in extending your reach into other states, or not!

Q: I originally obtained my license many years ago and as my business grew, I formed a Corporation and continued growing it over the years and eventually sold the shares and was able to “retire”. I’m considering acting as a Construction consultant now, but I know my qualification is long expired and I’m not willing to go through testing and what not. I would like to be able to supervise construction for Home Owners (mostly people I know) and advise them on hiring subs, etc. Am I correct that I don’t need a Contractor’s License for that, right?


A: Not necessarily. That is somewhat of a gray area, but consultants who supervise all of the construction and hiring subcontractors are technically acting in the capacity of a Contractor and do require a license issued by the CSLB.

Q: I am licensed in California with a “B” General Building, “C-39” Roofing, “C-10” Electrical, and “C-20” HVAC license. I want to get the same licenses in Arizona and take advantage of the Reciprocal agreement. I already requested the documentation from the CSLB for the “License by Endorsement” proof. If I understand correctly, I am going to have to show that I took the equivalent exams in CA. I remember that I definitely took the General Building, Roofing, and HVAC exams, but I had an electrician work for me for five years with his license/qualification, and after the five years I was able to replace him as the “C-10” qualifier by a Waiver of the Trade exam. If the reciprocity will not work for the Electrical license, will my “B” General license cover me to do everything?

A: You are correct in that you need to show that you’ve taken and passed the equivalent exam in one of the reciprocal States, so being that you secured a Waiver of the “C-10”, you will not qualify for Reciprocity for

the Electrical license. The “B” license in Arizona allows you to contract for work which involves trades related to building a structure from the ground up. HOWEVER, you cannot self -perform electrical work without the specialty license. With a General Building license, all work related to electrical, plumbing, air conditioning systems, boilers, swimming pools, spas and water wells must be subcontracted to an appropriately licensed Contractor if you do not have that particular specialty license.

While knowledge is power, knowing where to go for the answers is half the battle.
