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Ways to Create Sustainable Business Practices in Workplace

A recent article from the Green Business Bureau lists 20 sustainable practices. We'll include a few here.

Use No-VOC Interior Paints


Achieve Sustainable Business Practices Through Zero-waste Break Rooms

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CBIA Announces 2023 Housing Killer and Housing Creator Bills

SACRAMENTO - The California Building Industry Association (CBIA) today announced its annual Housing Killers and Housing Creators list, which identifies bills in the 2023 legislative session that would either make California's housing crisis worse or make it easier to build acutely needed homes.

Housing Killers restrict, slow and add costs to home construction, negatively impacting California's widening racial homeownership gap and exacerbating the wealth gap between Black and Latino families compared to white families. Housing Creators reduce barriers to housing production and advance equity in homeownership.

"To address our state's severe housing crisis and inequities in homeownership, California needs to produce more homes at a price more middle- and low-income families can afford," said Dan Dunmoyer, CBIA President and CEO. "CBIA supports smart Housing Creator policy proposals that reduce barriers for the construction of more homes that California families desperately want and need. We strongly oppose Housing Killer proposals that block home construction and exacerbate inequalities in homeownership. We call on California's policymakers to support Housing Creators and reject Housing Killers this legislative session."

Homeownership helps to stabilize and strengthen communities and is the single biggest wealth-building factor for families. Underproduction has led to a chronic lack of supply of homes that middle- and low-income families can afford and has driven up the cost of rent. California's housing crisis is driving Californians out of state in record levels and denying many families the benefits of homeownership.

2023 Housing Killers

AB 68 (Ward, D-San Diego) - Severely Restricts Land Available for Housing Development in Favor of Extraordinary Expensive Urban Infill Projects. AB 68 would make California's already extreme housing shortage worse by only allowing for homes to be built in downtown neighborhoods, preventing local governments from permitting new housing units in most of their suburban neighborhoods, and eliminating construction jobs associated with that new housing. This will considerably increase the cost of housing by greatly reducing California's land available for development by only allowing for much more expensive multi-family high rise homes to be built.

<u>AB 1000 (Reyes, D-San Bernardino)</u> – Warehouses. AB 1000 would create a statewide, arbitrary setback of 1,000 feet from hospitals, homes, schools, daycares and/or elderly housing for logistics use facilities. Given how expansive this is, it is regarded as a de facto ban on warehouses throughout the state. A ban on warehouses will inevitably exacerbate supply chain issues, increase the threat of frivolous litigation for California businesses, push more trade away from California ports and devastate housing production in the process.

<u>AB 1030 (Kalra, D-San Jose)</u> - State Contracting. AB 1030 would require a contractor or subcontractor contracting with a state agency to certify that the wood used in their projects is not sourced from certain regions, regardless of existing policies to protect those areas. This runs contrary to current high standards for North American sustainable forestry practices and certification standards that apply "chain of custody" requirements, creating additional barriers for California home construction.

<u>AB 1333 (Ward, D-San Diego)</u> - Prohibiting Bundle Sales. AB 1333 would prohibit residential homebuilders from selling more than one home in California. Homebuilders would be required to hold the homes they produce as rental property. This bill would also apply to condominiums and cooperative housing that include up to four units on one parcel. This bill would radically reduce the production of owner-occupied homes, further exacerbating the housing crisis and racial disparities in homeownership rates.

<u>SB 253 (Wiener, D-San Francisco)</u> - Climate Corporate Data Accountability Act. SB 253 would require the State Air Resources Board, on or before January 1, 2025, to develop and adopt regulations requiring companies that do business in California to publicly disclose to the state's emissions registry how each of the hundreds of products used to build a home.

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CBIA Announces 2023 Housing Killer and Housing Creator Bills

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<u>SB 571 (Allen, D-Redondo Beach)</u> - Development Projects: Emergency Preparedness. SB 571 would establish a new statemandated program and impose new duties on local governments to create a one-size-fits-all evacuation plan process for all newly created master planned communities. This process would directly conflict with other state laws that mandate reduced traffic flow (VMT), creating an impossible to resolve bureaucratic conflict. This bill would add the fourth set of regulations or guidance in this same policy area issued in the past 12 months on fire safety, creating confusion and conflicting direction which will slow down much needed home construction and make homes more expensive.

2023 Housing Creators

<u>SB 393 (Glazer, D-Orinda)</u> - California Environmental Quality Act: judicial challenge: identification of contributors. SB 393 is a CEQA reform measure that requires a CEQA plaintiff to disclose any contributions of \$5,000 or more that he or she has received to help fund their legal action. It also prevents a CEQA legal action from being filed against a housing project that was included as part of a larger plan or project already approved under CEQA.


SB 405 (Cortese, D-Santa Clara) - Planning and zoning: housing element. inventory of sites: regional housing need. SB 405 would improve accuracy of housing element reporting and planning by requiring planning agencies to provide notice to owners of sites included in local housing element inventory reports that their site is included in that inventory. If the site owner notifies the planning agency or the housing department that the owner does not intend to develop at least 80% of the number of units for the site during the current planning period, the site would not be considered a site that can be developed to meet the jurisdiction's share of the regional housing need. The bill would require the planning agency to make a reasonable effort to identify an owner and the owner's contact information and to determine the intent of the owner to develop the site.

<u>AB 1236 (Grayson, D-Concord)</u> - Fire Sprinklers. Recent regulations require residential fire sprinklers, but the hook-up fees have become extremely problematic for housing development. This bill will streamline and reduce the hook-up fees for residential fire sprinklers.

To achieve Housing For All, California's must build more homes across all income levels. CBIA calls on the Legislature and Governor to note the Housing Killer and Housing Creator lists and take more action to address the state's housing crisis.

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
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Americans Using Unhealthy Coping Mechanisms to Manage Mental Health

Finding ways to deal with mental health issues can be challenging. People turn to behaviors including restricted or binge eating, excessive gambling and even extreme social media use. According to the GeneSight Mental Health Monitor, a survey from Myriad Genetics, 77% of Americans said they have used at least one addictive behavior and/or unhealthy coping mechanism to manage their mental health issues.

The GeneSight Mental Health Monitor is a nationwide survey conducted online by ACUPOLL Precision Research, Inc. in February 2023 among a statistically representative sample (n=1000) of U.S. adults age 18+. The survey included a representative sample of adults diagnosed with depression and anxiety.

Nearly all Americans (94%) surveyed agree that substance and behavioral addictions often mask underlying mental health issues. Though they may view these behaviors as addictive or as unhealthy coping mechanisms (or both), many admit to still using them .

"Mental health and addiction often go hand-in-hand," said Morgan Freas, PharmD, a senior medical science liaison with Myriad Genetics, in a statement. "Yet the stigma associated with admitting mental health challenges is often greater than escaping into substance or behavioral abuse."

The survey found those diagnosed with depression and/or anxiety consider drinking alcohol alone as an unhealthy coping mechanism, addictive behavior or both (77%). Yet, 41% of these respondents admitted to drinking alone to cope. In fact, 25% of this segment who said they heavily drank alone admitted they were worried they had a problem.

Medication trial and error may prompt unhealthy choices.

Two-thirds of those diagnosed with depression and/ or anxiety have experienced trial and error in trying to find medication that works for them. Nearly half of this segment (45%) report they have turned to an unhealthy coping mechanism as a result of a medication failure.

Those diagnosed with depression and/or anxiety admitted to using the following coping mechanisms:

- Sleeping too much or too little 70%
- Withdrawing from social activities 64%
- Binge watching TV or movies 49%
- Skipping work/school/household responsibilities 48%
 The survey found that of those who were told they have a problem, 58% of those diagnosed with depression and/or anxiety say mental health treatment helped relieve their addiction concerns.

Mental health trends: Rising depression and anxiety rates and their impacts

The GeneSight Mental Health Monitor tracks depression/anxiety rates as well as factors driving mental health concerns and their impact on people's lives. Comparing spring 2023 and spring 2022 survey results, significantly more Americans are experiencing symptoms of depression and anxiety compared to just one year prior.

The top factors negatively impacting mental health in the past year, among those dissatisfied with their mental health, include (respondents selected top 3 in the 2023 survey):

- Cost of living 42%
- Relationships with a family member or friend 36%
- Ability to financially support my family 29%
- Body image 25%
- Death of a close friend/family member 20%
- Workplace performance/satisfaction 16%
- What others think of me 16%
- Dependence on alcohol or drugs 13%
- Spread of COVID or another public health concern 11%
- A medical diagnosis for myself or a loved one 11%

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How to Handle Construction Equipment Spending in 2023

Business owners need to be careful with their spending and managing their balance sheets during 2023, to avoid the pit-falls of inflation and overspending.

It is still a bit nuts out there. The economic and construction ball just keeps going up and down, up and down.

- Inflation is still with us, and it looks like it will be tough to get rid of.
- Because of inflation, it looks like interest rates will keep rising and be around longer than anticipated.
- While some material costs have decreased, supply chain issues continue to drive the purchasing folks nuts.
- Electric vehicles (EV) is still at the top of the list when it comes to looking at new equipment, but there are alternatives.
- And if I see or hear one more ERC commercial, I am going to put a hole in the TV.
- AI, I hope, will replace the ERC hype. And AI sooner rather than later will have you managing your work without getting out of bed.

What all this tells me, from a financial perspective for just about every business out there, is TO MANAGE THE BALANCE SHEET to avoid cash flow and bank covenant issues.

With a number of dealer groups I work with, there is an understanding that whatever happens in the auto industry will soon show up on their doorstep. And nine times out of 10, that premise holds true. When you think about it, what happens at the dealer and rental company level falls on your plate, too. In short, what happens in the auto industry probably impacts your business, as well.

So, I would like you to go on YouTube and search for Wealthion Lucky Lopez. It is a 51-minute presentation that will inform you about what to take into account in terms or your equipment needs going forward. I watched this program three times and concluded that it all makes sense, because the discussion ties it all together. After you take the plunge, it will be a lot easier to make your CapEx decisions for 2023. Lucky is not only a car nut, but also an auto industry nut. He owns dealerships, auction operations, deals in auto purchase and lease paper, and as a result touches all aspects of the industry, which helps him form his thoughts on the cycle taking place.

In terms of alternative fuels and EV, to replace most diesel or gasoline machines, you have options, but it is not a one-size-fits-all solution. You have BATTERY ELECTRIC, DIESEL- ELECTRIC HYBRIDS, HYDROGEN and HYDROGEN FUEL CELLS. As of now, EV is up and running, with the others close behind.

My concern with the new green, eco-friendly models is the cost, versus what you would have to pay (if you can get a new unit) for the standard propulsion system you have been using. I understand the need to reduce emissions, but I also understand that higher priced new units will require a higher cost to be passed on in your bids to customers. And when I hear that some new units can cost two to three times the cost of the current models, that worries me.

From what I have seen and read, it appears the cost of operation of the new operating systems will have a lower cost, which will make up for the initial higher cost of ownership. But in the meantime YOU HAVE HIGHER COSTS TO DEAL WITH that will impact cash flow, insurance cost, debt service and bank covenants. And believe me these HIGHER COST issues are major issues to be dealt with.

- A \$50,000 unit at 8% over 60 months will require a \$1,104 monthly payment with \$10,829 of interest.
- A \$150,000 unit at 8% over 60 months will require a \$3,041 monthly payment with \$32,000 of interest.

Sure, you will have an income tax benefit if you use bonus depreciation and/or Section 179, assuming you have taxable income to offset the deprecation against. But remember, when you sell the unit you will have a 100% recapture on the selling price, no matter what your book value is.

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



So, I have two concerns. Will you be able to pass these higher costs on to customers? Because if not, cash flow will suffer. The second concern being the increase in fixed cost, higher interest payments and an increase in bank debt or lease payments, all of which could negatively impact bank covenant ratios. And one last concern addresses collateral values.

Bank loans are based on collateral values. They like to be covered on the loan to value (LTV) ratios, because if they are not, it will cause them a load of trouble, which will be passed on to the borrower (that's YOU). As with many new products that hit the market, the initial cost to purchase is high, which then decreases as more units are produced. You can expect to have the value of your used piece of equipment decrease in value, maybe forcing the LOV ratio to go negative. Believe me, I have been through this before. . . "Mr./Mrs. Customer, we find that your equipment value is less than the outstanding balance and YOU have to fix that." The bank will not care if your maintenance on the new unit is lower then your spend on the old equipment; they will request payment to put the ratio back to where they need it to be. Watch the auto presentation to see what I mean.


In the end, in this economic environment, I believe the balance sheet has to be as strong as you can make it. Consequently, CapEx expenditures need to be carefully considered before you sign your name to the contract.

You may want to ask the rental companies you use to rent you one of these new products to see how it works before you commit to a purchase. Or, you may want to rent until the pricing comes down to more realistic prices. Or you may want to wait until some of the other alternative machines are available for sale. But, whatever you do, please be careful and make sure cash flow is properly maintained.





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



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Capitol Connection Q&A for Contractors

It might sound like the same license, but when crossing state lines, it's real meaning might be different in important ways. Our other questions illustrate why reading contractor law, re-reading and then calling an expert is often the best finish!...

Q: We have a General Building license "B" in California, and we have been approached to do some work for one of our large developers in Nevada. They are telling us we need to obtain "B-2" and "B-6" licenses in Nevada. Does that sound correct to you? Doesn't NV have just a General License which is equivalent to California's?

A: Nevada has a "B" license which is equivalent to the "B" in CA. However, in order to qualify for Nevada's full "B" license, your Qualifier will need to show proof, in the way of references/verification statements, that they have done work on structures over three stories in height. If your Qualifier does not have that relevant experience, the "B-2" along with the "B-6" would be the appropriate classifications.

Q: Regarding the NV License that you are helping us with currently, I was reviewing the statute and noticed that there is a reference to an application regarding conversion of business organization of licensee ("NAC 624.667 Submission of application regarding conversion of business organization of licensee. A licensee shall submit an application to the Board regarding a conversion of the licensee conducted pursuant to chapter 92A of NRS before or within 30 days after such a conversion is made.").

Can this application be used if the licensee merges with and into a new entity (i.e., can our currently licensed entity file this application and then merge with the new entity to hold the license), or is the application only meant for conversions (i.e., an entity converts from an LLC to a corporation)?


A: That latter, the conversion application only applies if the entity is converting from an LLC to a corporation, vice versa, or if the entity is converting in order to change its jurisdiction, etc. The conversion application will not work in your situation. We will need to stay on the same course of obtaining a brand-new license for your newly formed entity.

Q: I was looking into CA Business and Professions Code 7068.1(a)(3) which states that a person can act in the capacity of qualifying party if "the majority of the Partners, Officers, or Managers are the same". Where are those changes to the Officers to made? With the CSLB or with the Secretary of State?

A: Both! The Officers listed with the CA Secretary of State need to match what you have listed on your Contractors License.
